A few other ways to deter criminal activity...

Porch and garage lights on after dark.

If you don't have lights by side or back doors we suggest you install them.

Motion detector/ flood lights in back yards.

ALWAYS check windows and doors to make sure they're locked. If you have deadbolts, use them. Keep your door from garage locked at all times.

ALWAYS lock you cars and set alarms.

Post a "Beware of Dog" sign.

Set your alarm system.

Make arrangements to stop mail and papers or have a neighbor collect it for you if you are to be out of town. Have neighbors park cars in your driveway. Put your trash cans away.

Leave lights on if you're going to be away, timers work great for this.

Padlocks on gates.

Report suspicious cars or people walking in the neighborhood at weird hours The sheriff's office would rather check than have something happen that could have been avoided.

Put bells on your doors, even if you forget to lock them you will hear those should someone enter your house. If you hear someone in your house, lock your bedroom door, and call 911.
